FOR YOUR STAFF

FAFSA completion training

Trellis can provide in-person and online (via webinar) FAFSA completion training and resource handouts.

We guide you through the application and highlight the areas where students and their families are most likely to have trouble or get confused.

FAFSA training is also available for local high school counselors and community-based organizations.

Texting campaign

Messages are customized by institution and geared toward both current and newly admitted students.

- Fall awareness: Texts inform students that the 2019-2020 FAFSA is available, point them toward helpful resources, and encourage timely completion.
- Spring campaign: Messages are geared toward newly admitted and current students who haven't completed the FAFSA and students selected for verification.
- Summer: Focus on guarding against "summer melt" by supporting students with information to ensure fall enrollment.

FOR YOUR STUDENTS

Posters/stuffers

Information for distribution around campus to remind students to complete the FAFSA and where to find resources when they need help. The stuffers can be put in regular mail going to the students and distributed at student gatherings.

Handout in both English and Spanish lays out eights steps to applying for financial aid by completing the FAFSA.

In-person assistance

FAFSA completion workshops for current students and those still in area high schools.

Financial coaching

- Available for currently enrolled and admitted students, along with their parents (if dependent students).
- Assistance is available from the start of the application through the refund, including submitting the FAFSA, understanding types of aid, comparing award letters, and verification.





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
