Non-Matriculation Surveys

- Survey designed to investigate why accepted students fail to matriculate
- Common survey questions
- Typical findings?
 - Problems with financial aid
 - Course/Major offerings
 - Family/personal issues
 - Campus tours or visitations



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Stop-Out and Re-engagement Surveys

- Survey to capture the reasons students are no longer enrolled and how the institution can re-engage stop-out students
- Common survey questions
- Typical findings?
 - Issues related to financial aid
 - Personal financial reasons
 - Academic issues
 - Transfer intentions



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Student Experience Surveys

- Surveys designed to provide institution with a better understanding of their students, enrollment patterns, satisfaction with faculty and staff, financial aid, etc.
- Common survey questions:
 - Enrollment plans for the upcoming semester
 - Adequacy of technology (laptops, software, etc.)
 - Satisfaction with different course delivery methods
 - Satisfaction with registration, financial aid, student affairs, etc.
 - Open-entry response items on how the institution can support the student at this time
 - Other items of interest to the institution

Student Retention Focus Groups

- Focus groups with former and current students, as well as faculty/staff, to investigate the experiences of stop-out students
- Typical findings?
 - Financial aid or affordability reasons
 - Issues with work/school balance
 - Personal/family issues
 - Personal finances



Customized Research Projects

- Trellis Research is also available to do custom research projects [surveys, focus groups, interviews]
- Common research questions:
 - What are the impacts of COVID-19 on our students?
 - How can we better support our students during the pandemic?
 - How satisfied were students during orientation, registration, or other activities?
 - What are the technology needs of our students?



What is required of schools to field these projects?

- To field most of our survey, focus group, or interview projects, we will need:
 - Approval of a scope of work (SOW) and survey documents
 - Contact information for study population
 - First Name
 - Last Name
 - Email Address (Personal or Institutional, depending on initiative)
 - Other variables of interest, as determined by the institution
 - Such as: GPA, gender, race/ethnicity, last semester enrolled, credits earned, first-generation status, etc.



Deliverables

- Trellis will deliver a report of findings and present (via Zoom or other remote interface) to relevant staff at the Institution.
- For select projects, institutions will receive a list of students interested in enrollment
- The institution will report to Trellis how the research findings were implemented (Research to Practice).





Data Analyses: Cohort Default Rate (CDR) and Retention Analyses

Cohort Default Rate Analysis

- Default and delinquency analysis using National Student Loan Data System (NSLDS) data files and institutional data.
- Trellis creates a file of unduplicated borrowers from the institution's most recently closed cohort.
- The Institution matches a set of institutional variables to that cohort of borrowers.



Cohort Default Rate Analysis (cont.)

Field Names	Comments	Business Rules
Pell Grant	Student received a Pell grant at any point while attending the institution.	Y=Yes; N=No
Enrollment Status		G=Graduated; W=Withdrew
Program CIP Code	8-digit cipcode for student's program of study.	Must be numeric
GPA	Cumulative GPA on a 4.0 scale.	Must be numeric
Developmental Education	Student enrolled in a developmental education course at any point while attending the institution.	Y=Yes; N=No
Enrollment Intensity	Enrollment during their last semester.	F=Full-time; P=Part-time
Dependency Status	Status during last their semester enrolled.	D=Dependent; I=Independent



Cohort Default Rate Analysis (cont.)

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Retention Analysis

- Trellis conducts an analysis of student characteristics and how they relate to retention.
- The Institution provides a data file or file(s) containing institutional student-level data.

Why Participate?



- Self-reported, online survey that documents the financial well-being and student success indicators of postsecondary students.
- The SFWS is 100% free for schools to use.
- Provides evidence that can open doors that are currently shut.

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How are schools using the findings?

<u>Planning</u>: Develop baseline metrics, assess areas for program growth, target resources...

<u>Financial education</u>: Inform topic areas and instructional design for student loan counseling and financial education, assist with financial plans for graduation, ensure enrollment in safe financial products...

<u>Financial resources</u>: Create resource networks, develop financial crisis intervention teams, distribute emergency aid...

<u>Fundraising and community engagement</u>: Demonstrate need for student support, advocate for resources, engage community partners...



Steps to Participate
